Julian was also a long-serving Executive Committee member and board member of the Westchester Jewish Council. Julian believed that doing tzedakah was just as important as giving tzedakah. Adam Waldman Anti-Defamation League (ADL)

Adam Waldman chairs the Advocacy and Community Outreach Committee (ACOC) of the New York/New Jersey Anti-Defamation League Regional Board. Adam officially joined the Regional Board after the merger of the New York and New Jersey regions in 2019. In addition to chairing its advocacy and community outreach, he is also a member of the Development Committee of the Regional Board.



Under Adam's leadership of the ACOC, the New York / New Jersey Region has maintained and grown its relationships with state and federal elected officials. The ACOC has supported local ADL interest groups in Westchester, New York City, New Jersey, and Long Island as they reach out to village, town and county government officials. In addition, the ACOC has restarted interfaith initiatives such as the interfaith seder.

Since becoming involved with ADL in 2016, Adam has attended either in person or virtually every National Leadership Summit and Never is Now conference – the latter being the world's largest annual summit on antisemitism and hate. Previously he was involved with organizing and promoting the Securing Justice Dinners in Westchester.

Adam is the Chief Financial Officer of Assembled Universe, a holding company owned by Adam Pritzker, which systematically develops the next generation of consumer, software, and financial services brands and platforms into an ever-expanding universe of companies. In addition to his BS from Cornell University, he earned his MBA from the NYU Leonard Stern School of Business.

Adam and his wife Rebecca have three children, Ari (11), Emmanuelle (9) and Meyer (6). They have lived in Irvington since 2016.

ADL is a leading anti-hate organization that was founded in 1913 in response to an escalating climate of antisemitism and bigotry. Today, ADL is the first call when acts of antisemitism occur and continues to fight all forms of hate. A global leader in exposing extremism, delivering anti-bias education and fighting hate online, ADL's ultimate goal is a world in which no group or individual suffers from bias, discrimination or hate.

Elizabeth Haas Edersheim Bet Am Shalom Synagogue

Elizabeth Haas Edersheim co-chairs the Security Committee for Bet Am Shalom (BAS) Synagogue, a vibrant, egalitarian Reconstructionist congregation in White Plains. In this role, Elizabeth helped to build BAS's Community Security Service (CSS) team and is very active in county-wide CSS activities. Because of the committee and Elizabeth's hard work, more than 60 of Bet Am Shalom's congregants now have CSS training



and are part of its security effort. Elizabeth engages with the planning, writing and implementation of BAS's Homeland Security grant applications, as well.

Elizabeth also co-chaired Bet Am Shalom's Craft Show Committee in 2020 and 2021, with a mission of bringing the Jewish community together to celebrate the finest of contemporary Jewish crafts and the artists who create them. Under her leadership, the committee formed a team of over 80 volunteer congregants and launched a virtual craft show with the support and active participation of Hebrew Institute of White Plains and The Leffell School.

Additionally, in April of 2019, Elizabeth unofficially assumed the role of Zoom host and coordinator for remote Friday evening services. She proudly continues in this role for now-hybrid services.

Elizabeth teaches at NYU's Preston Robert Tisch Institute where she co-leads a city-based research and consulting partnership with the Conference of Mayors and advises the dean on the school's strategy. In addition to the many hours she gives to Bet Am Shalom, Elizabeth also spends time advising fellowship teams in the Ashoka Globalizer Program and volunteers at Chalkbeat, American Journalism Project and NYC Community Schools, working on issues that are close to her heart.

Elizabeth is inspired weekly by Bet Am's Rabbi Les Bronstein and Cantor Benji Ellen Schiller, and daily by members, volunteers and staff, who are dedicated to enhancing our collective community and enriching the lives of all. She is continually looking to find new ways to serve Bet Am Shalom and the community.

Bet Am Shalom, a Reconstructionist synagogue, warmly welcomes all generations and religious backgrounds, including interfaith families, empty nesters, singles, LGBTQ, the scholarly and observant, and those new to Judaism. The community is bound together by a shared belief in a thoughtful and progressive approach to Judaism. With a deep respect for tradition, Bet Am Shalom seeks to evolve as the world evolves. The creative spirit of its members fuels its community as they learn, share lifecycle events, support each other and commit to Tikkun Olam.

Peter Schlactus Chayurat Tikyah

Peter Schlactus and his wife, Jennifer, joined Chavurat Tikvah 20 years ago after falling in love with its ruach-rich, "family-style" take on Jewish community and worship. Volunteering soon followed because that's what everyone does in the Chavurah. Peter has served as Newsletter Editor, Archives Digitizer, Retreat Planner, Social Action Volunteer, Holiday Organizer and Co-President, among other roles.



Peter soon gravitated to helping lead music for worship services, holidays, and religious school: singing and playing both the guitar and the cello. He has been honored to lead music at several B'nai Mitzvah ceremonies for former religious school students, including his own now-college-age children, Joshua and Abby.

After contributing cello music to High Holiday services for many years, this past year Peter took on the responsibility (cooperatively with our spiritual leader, Cantor Haley Kobilinsky) of leading Chavurat Tikvah's High Holiday services, following the "retirement" of friends and mentors, Merri and Ramie Arian, after 40 years. Peter can't remember working so hard on a project or feeling so gratified by its fruition. The support he felt from fellow chaverim was a testament to the group's special character.

Peter gives back to the wider community, as well. He leads monthly Shabbat services for The Atria Rye Brook senior living community, where his mother resides. After retiring from a successful 25-year career as an insurance broker, Peter now runs a nonprofit association serving the needs of local delivery drivers. Peter serves on the Westchester Airport Advisory Board and chairs the Rye Brook Airport Advisory Council. He sits on the Board of The Coalition to Prevent Westchester Airport Expansion and the Westchester Chamber Music Society. His proudest volunteer role, however, was reestablishing and leading Rye Brook Cub Scout Pack #3, which brought with it priceless family memories.

Peter is honored to be thought of in connection with Julian Bernstein and credits the love and support of his immediate family along with the inspiration and mentorship of his chavurah family.

Chavurat Tikvah is a congregation of about 24 families with members of all ages and religious backgrounds. We are a participatory community that gathers in each other's homes for personal, intimate, creative, and meaningful Jewish experiences. Members create and host their own services, organize social action, and choose topics and experiences for their own Jewish learning, all with the help of our spiritual leader. This is a group that cares for each other like family, where we confront the challenges of life together, and where we celebrate and interpret Jewish tradition in ways that make it resonate in today's world. We are affiliated with the Union of Reform Judaism, and we welcome traditional and non-traditional families and individuals alike.

Guy Shmuel CSS – Community Security Service

Guy Shmuel serves as the Regional Manager for Westchester County on behalf of The Community Security Service (CSS), the leading Jewish volunteer security nonprofit organization in the United States.

Guy began his volunteering and training with CSS in 2012 and was subsequently named Westchester Regional Manager where he currently leads all security volunteer operations for synagogues and Jewish events across the



county, as well as in The Bronx's Riverdale neighborhood. With a keen understanding of the security needs of local New York-area Jewish institutions, Guy ensures that his volunteer security teams are in the best position to ensure the safety of congregants, particularly as American Jews are facing increased threats of violence and antisemitism. By being involved in the safety and security of one's own community, Guy wholeheartedly believes that such participation is a proven approach to saving lives, as evidenced by the volunteer security model long adopted by Jewish communities across the world. As a senior volunteer, Guy also mentors other regional managers who are in the process of organizing teams in new regions.

Born in Israel, Guy grew up in the United Kingdom and has lived in Westchester for 23 years, where he and his wife have raised their three children. His daughter is currently serving in the Israel Defense Force (IDF) and his son will be starting his IDF service this coming summer.


At Community Security Service (CSS), the mission is simple: Protecting Jewish Life and Jewish Way of Life. Partnering with Jewish organizations, governmental authorities, and law enforcement agencies, CSS safeguards the community by training volunteers in professional security techniques and providing physical security. CSS offers training, guidance, and resources to community members who stand ready as volunteers to protect their own against the increasing atmosphere of violent incidents and terrorism.

Lisa Mazure Congregation B'nai Yisrael

Lisa Mazure is an attorney who has served the local community since moving to Westchester County over 27 years ago.

Lisa served on the Board of Trustees of Congregation B'nai Yisrael for six years, during which time she co-chaired the Caring & Social Action Committee. For three of those years, she also served as the Vice President of CBY.

She spearheaded the formation of and CBY's engagement



Lisa also started and runs a program in which CBY volunteers lead Shabbat services at the local assisted living facility. This program brings peace and joy to the Jewish residents there. In 2020 Lisa coordinated a mitzvah project for the facility where congregants assembled Chanukah bags at their homes, so everyone had a sense of doing a mitzvah in the worst days of the pandemic. She has also worked with the Director at this facility to ensure that the Jewish residents have other holiday celebrations.

Lisa helped to connect CBY with The Community Center of Northern Westchester. This partnership has provided food, pajamas, backpacks, school supplies, and clothing to the CCNW. The entire CBY community gets involved with food and clothing drives and these efforts bring us together in addition to fulfilling very real needs.

Lisa has also led CBY's annual Midnight Run to bring hot meals and clothing to the homeless in NYC. The efficiency with which the CBY Midnight Run has been done led the Midnight Run Organization to hold CBY up as a model for other organizations on how to organize a successful run.

In her capacity as a practicing attorney, Lisa has handled pro-bono domestic violence cases and has helped families avoid eviction from their homes.

Congregation B'nai Yisrael is a warm and vibrant Reform congregation discovering and celebrating positive experiences with individuals of every age. Congregation B'nai Yisrael is a spiritual center where individuals and families, celebrate, commemorate, worship, learn, nurture, give, and grow. Margot Metzger Congregation Kneses Tifereth Israel

Margot 's Metzger's journey at Congregation KTI began when she and her husband, Steve, moved to Rye Brook in 2004. They wanted to join a synagogue where their children could attend pre-school and religious school and where they could be part of a small, vibrant Jewish community. For 18 years, KTI has been their family's Jewish "home away from home."



Margot became progressively involved at KTI as a volunteer and lay leader. In 2007, she joined the Project Reimagine Task Force, which developed and implemented experiential family learning programs for KTI's Religious School. Through this experience, Margot and her family formed bonds with other families, who became the core of the KTI community for them. Margot's participation in Project Reimagine led to her joining the Religious School Board and Board of Trustees. She later joined the Executive Committee as Vice President, Education, continuing to focus on KTI's excellent educational programs. Margot also has enjoyed volunteering on many projects, celebrations, and fundraising, deepening her commitment to the KTI community.

In 2018, Margot became Co-President of KTI and held that position for four years. During that time, KTI experienced many exciting changes, including welcoming a new Rabbi. The past two years during the pandemic presented many challenges and Margot is grateful to her Co-President and KTI's lay leadership, Rabbi, Cantor, administration, and staff for working together to keep the KTI community connected and thriving. Margot continues to serve on KTI's Executive Committee.

Devoting time to KTI has enriched Margot's busy family and professional life while raising two children and working full-time as an attorney. Margot is Vice President & Senior Counsel at Marriott International and previously at Starwood Hotels & Resorts Worldwide. Before joining Starwood, Margot was a partner at Bryan Cave LLP in New York. Margot received her B.A. from the University of Pennsylvania and her J.D. from New York University School of Law.

Margot is honored to be recognized for her commitment to KTI and her community.

Irene Herz was born and raised in Brooklyn, New York. She received her BA from Barnard College.

After several years working as a librarian for the Brooklyn Public Library and a brief stint selling the first personal computers on the market, she branched out into the burgeoning world of online computing working for early internet company Prodigy and later to ITT. Transitioning



from the corporate to the non-profit world, she worked at the Leukemia Lymphoma Society which led to a freelance career creating websites for small businesses and individuals. Although she did not make as much money, Irene found her freelance work very rewarding.

During her thirty-odd years living in Ossining, Irene served as a Director at her local League of Women Voters chapter. She served for eight years on the board of the Ossining Public Library, one of those as President. Irene was the President of the Ossining Rotary Club and was also President of the Taconic Opera, in which company she sang, joyfully, as a chorus member.

Irene has been a member of the Hebrew Congregation of Somers for about seven years. Soon after she became a member, she joined the Ritual Committee and the Membership Committee. Her first volunteer task was to corral Torah and Haftorah readers for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur as well as enlisting Purim readers. She used her computer expertise to help maintain the synagogue website. She served on the Search Committee for a new rabbi. As a member of Sisterhood, Irene collated and edited a cookbook for Sisterhood. (Yes, there are a few copies still left for sale!) She also designed HCS-logoed greeting cards for congregants to send to friends and loved ones.

More recently she has been writing "Torah Tidbits," a brief take on the weekly Torah portion, aimed at children. She has been creating and sending out HCS' weekly email newsletter, called HCSHappenings, a task that involves her creative skills as well as some sitzfleisch. She currently serves as Recording Secretary of the Board of Directors.

Irene lives in Somers with her husband of 36 years and her cat Flopsy.

Hebrew Congregation of Somers is part of a living tradition that evolves along with our changing times. HCS leans Reconstructionist, and encourage living a mitzvahcentered life over a self-centered one. Bette Keesing Sparago Holocaust & Human Rights Education Center

In her retirement letter to the North Salem Central School District's Board of Education, Bette quoted Winston Churchill. "You make a living by what you get. You make a life by what you give." She made a living teaching French, Spanish and Latin for 40 years, doing what she loves; speaking other languages and sharing her enthusiasm



with adolescents. At North Salem she served as Chairperson of the Foreign Language Department. As her family is originally from The Netherlands, she grew up in a bilingual home speaking Dutch and English and reading German which she also speaks.

As quoted by Millie Jasper, Executive Director, "It's her zeal for languages and her unquenchable thirst for volunteerism that suited her so well for the Julian Y. Bernstein Distinguished Service Award. Bette uses many of those languages to speak with the Holocaust Survivors in their native tongue, a talent unmatched by any volunteer at the center." She volunteers as its Liaison for the Speakers Bureau and the Twin-With-A-Survivor program.

For over 40 years Bette has been a member and a volunteer for many professional organizations for Foreign Language teachers in New York State. So important was the French language to Bette that she began volunteering in the 1970s at the Alliance Française of Westchester. When it closed, she and a colleague reapplied for a new French charter, restarted, and financed all new programs. It took 5 years, and today the Alliance is thriving in White Plains.

From 2006 to 2019 Bette curated the New Rochelle Chapter of Hadassah's Journal. The money collected was sent directly to the Hadassah University Hospital-Ein Kerem for selected medical equipment. For her, volunteering is at the core of being a human being. Ever the volunteer, Bette does not rest. As a member of Temple Israel of Northern Westchester, she currently serves on the Sisterhood Board.

The Holocaust & Human Rights Education Center enhances the teaching and the learning of the lessons of the Holocaust and the right of all people to be treated with dignity and respect. HHREC encourages students to speak up and act against all forms of bigotry and prejudice. HHREC brings the lessons of the Holocaust, genocide, and human rights crimes to several thousand teachers, and through them, to thousands more middle and high school students.

Caren Hammerman Jewish National Fund

Caren Hammerman grew up in a suburban Boston town with a negligible Jewish population, yet her mother always made time for meaningful Jewish engagement, both at home and in organizational endeavors.

Over the past 38+ years she has lived in Westchester, Caren has been active in many Jewish community organizations. Arriving in Westchester, she found that



such involvement was the most rewarding way to meet people while doing good, and along the way formed her closest friendships. Caren launched her volunteer career with Hadassah, serving as President of the Aviva-Tamar New Rochelle chapter, then moved on to serve as PTA President of Westchester Day School in Mamaroneck, where her four children went to school. She then chaired the Scarsdale Women's Campaign of UJA.

Caren was privileged to be a Wexner Heritage Foundation Fellow, where she learned about the richness of Jewish history, religion and culture, and drew inspiration from so many dedicated Jewish leaders who participated with her. Graduating from that prestigious program gave Caren the confidence and skills to become President and then Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Westchester Day School.

Over the years, Caren has continued to be active with UJA-Federation, serving on the Marginalized Populations in Israel Committee. She currently sits on the Jewish Life in the Neighborhood Committee.

Overall, Caren's strongest commitment is to Jewish National Fund-USA, in which she was active for a stint in the 1990s. Since 2013, Caren served as President and is currently the Chairman of the Board of Westchester and Southern Connecticut.
