

## COMMUNITY CONNECTION, CONNECT-ORY AND DIGITAL MEDIA

Our weekly e-newsletter, <u>Community Connection</u>, was distributed to over 8,000 subscribers across Westchester and beyond. Each issue focused on community events, relevant news stories, and links to various resources in the community. The Council's website provided a constant source of community news and resources and housed the <u>Jewish Community Calendar</u> which listed a multitude of events hosted by our member organizations. In addition, the Council Facebook group and page (www.facebook.com/wjcouncil), and Council Instagram (@wjcouncil) reached over 3,000 individuals.

### **COMBATING ANTISEMITISM AND HATE**

The annual Westchester Thanksgiving Diversity Breakfast brought together more than 500 people from various faith and ethnic communities for a morning of community building and unity. Led by AJC Westchester/Fairfield and a coalition of organizations, the event was a true celebration of diversity.

We held our 2nd annual "Gather Against Hate" event with our partners in Westchester County government. The event was held indoors due to inclement weather, and with so many of our elected officials and clergy in attendance, it was a great success.





### **CONNECTING TO ISRAEL**

The Council is proud to reaffirm its commitment to deepen and strengthen the long-standing relationship between Westchester and the State of Israel.


We continued to work with our Westchester community Shlicha (emissary), Shachar, to create Israel programming including our Israel Connection Series and the Israel Roundtable, and to participate in the Celebrate Israel Parade. These events brought together community members who are Israel supporters and those who are interested in building relationships, discussing programming and any other matters related to Israel. We also celebrated to



other matters related to Israel. We also celebrated Israel's 75th Anniversary with the Jewish Agency for Israel (JAFI) throughout the spring with festivals in both northern and southern Westchester. We attended the annual JAFI Shlichim conference, where Shachar showcased her remarkable work. The conference was a gathering of passionate shlichim, dedicated support members, and enthusiastic volunteers from across the country.

### **GOVERNMENT RELATIONS**

With decades of experience, the Council continues to be a trusted liaison to Westchester's elected and public officials. Working with our officials, we attended and hosted various events, including Governor Hochul's press conference on housing and economic development, held at The Elisabeth Haub School of Law at Pace University, and the UJA & Westchester Jewish Council Annual Westchester Legislative Breakfast which boasted an impressive lineup of guest speakers including Congressman Michael Lawler and County Executive George Latimer.



### INTERFAITH AND INTERGROUP RELATIONS

This initiative creates and strengthens understanding, respect and unity among different faith and ethnic communities. Westchester clergy members from various faiths embarked on a Multi-faith Civil Rights Journey to Alabama. This initiative which was funded and coordinated by the UJA & Westchester



Jewish Council, provided an opportunity for the clergy to deepen their understanding of civil rights and social justice. We also hosted a multi-faith clergy event featuring the renowned Dr. George Bonanno in which he explored the powerful ways to help process grief and discover the resilience to move forward after experiencing loss.

### JEWISH LITERACY INITIATIVE

The Westchester Jewish Literacy Initiative continued with programming throughout the year. We held free community-wide lectures with esteemed guests Yossi Klein Halevi, who discussed his book <u>The Dreamers</u>, and Professor Eliayahu Stern who spoke about "The Enlightenment". We also had the privilege of hosting Professor Steven Fine, who presented on Yochi Brandes' <u>The Orchard</u>. The event, which drew nearly 200 attendees, was a resounding success.

### **JULIAN Y. BERNSTEIN DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS (DSA)**

In May, the Westchester Jewish Council honored 20 deserving volunteer leaders from our member organizations with the Annual Julian Y. Bernstein Distinguished Service Award (DSA). Julian Y. Bernstein was a former Council board member who was a visionary communal leader. Julian believed that doing tzedakah was just as important as giving tzedakah. In tribute to his passion and devotion to the Jewish community, we honored those who follow in his footsteps. Member organizations were invited to nominate a volunteer from within their organization whose dedication and leadership have enriched our Westchester community.



### **NEW MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS**

We welcomed several new member organizations last year, including American Friends of ALYN, Club Z, Congregation Sons of Adath Israel of Riverdale, Jewish Agency for Israel and Westchester Torah Academy.











### **ROUNDTABLES**



The Council continued to promote community building and knowledge sharing through its signature Roundtables initiative. Over 20 Roundtables were organized this year for a diverse range of leaders including security volunteers, synagogue lay and professional leadership, clergy, marketing professionals and

volunteers, Israel activists, interfaith/intergroup volunteers, Mosaic of Westchester (a group that enriches our Jewish community through LGBTQ+ inclusion), youth professionals and volunteers and more. These Roundtables provided an excellent platform for lay and professional leaders to come together, build bonds and share best practices.

### **SECURITY**

The Council, as a Westchester Jewish community first responder, facilitated communications and the sharing of best practices of security among member organizations and government offices such as FBI and the Department of Homeland Security. Our "Emergency Communication System" allowed us to instantly communicate vital information to hundreds of trained Westchester Jewish professionals and volunteer leaders from our member organizations. We continued to partner with William Hayes from the Community Security Initiative (CSI) as well as partner with Community Security Service (CSS) and Security Community Network (SCN).

### **SECURITY (CONT.)**

The Council's annual "High Holiday Security Briefing" was held in September. This program was especially beneficial to our member synagogues. We were honored to have so many speakers and guests who attended and participated, including Jeffrey Kapelus, Security Chair, Westchester Jewish Council,



County Executive George Latimer, Westchester County Executive; Hon. Mimi Rocah, Westchester County District Attorney; Chief Dan McKenna, Chief Criminal Investigator at Westchester County District Attorney's Office; Chief Kevin Sylvester, Chief of Ossining Police Department and President of the Police Chiefs Association; Mitch Silber, Executive Director, CSI; Crystal Collins, Director of Policy & Programs Faith Based Initiatives and Urban Affairs for the Westchester County Executive; and Tejash V. Sanchala, Executive Director of the Westchester County Human Rights Commission.

### YOM HASHOAH/HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE

This countywide remembrance program, presented in partnership with the Holocaust and Human Rights Education Center, was held in April 2023 and included our annual rescued Torah procession. With hundreds of people in attendance, it was an honor to have esteemed guests, including Rev. Doris Dalton, Chair of the Westshester County Human



of the Westchester County Human Rights Commission, Rabbi Dr. Aliza Erber, County Executive George Latimer, representatives from the Westchester Board of Rabbis and Kol Hazzanim, and the Somers Holocaust Commission student winners.

### WESTCHESTER LEADERSHIP RECEPTION

We held our Sixth Annual Leadership Reception in September 2022. This event provided an opportunity for Council member organization leaders and elected officials to gather with each other and share plans and ideas for the coming year. Over 130 leaders from our member organizations gathered in the JCC Mid-Westchester's outdoor pavilion to hear inspiring words from dignitaries from the county and Israel including County Executive George Latimer, NY State Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins, Israel Deputy Consul General Israel Nitzan and so

many more.

# HISTORY AND FUNDING

The Westchester Jewish Council, founded in 1975, has prospered under the visionary leadership of our past Presidents (in order of service): Rabbi Amiel Wohl (z"l), Clarice Pressner (z"l), Hon. Samuel G. Fredman (z"l), Hon. Sam Eisenberg (z"l), Samuel Stein (z"l), Saul Singer (z"l), Donald Landis (z"l), Lester J. Millman, Irwin S. Davison, Debra Abrahams Weiner, Ronald E. Burton, Paul Warhit, Lisa T. Roberts and currently William H. Schrag.

Funding for the Westchester Jewish Council comes from a variety of sources. Sixty percent (60%) of our revenue comes from donations from individuals and foundations. Most of these donations are made in support of our sole fundraising event –our Gala- held each winter. Twenty percent (20%) comes from a generous grant from UJA. Fifteen percent (15%) comes from membership dues from our 130 member/partner organizations and five percent (5%) comes from programming. We thank you for your financial support which is so important to our mission. As an IRS-recognized 501c3 organization, all donations are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.
